On Monday, we gathered to celebrate the Word and reflect on the powerful message of the 2nd Sunday of Lent. Our focus was on the story of when Jesus went to the top of the mountain to pray. However, it has been inspiring to see how they've shown resilience in the face of challenges. When things got tough, they didn't give up. Instead, they worked through the problems with determination, asked great questions, and supported each other as they learned.

Today, is also 'World Maths Day'! It's been a fantastic week of maths, and we are incredibly proud of the effort and growth the children have shown. We encourage you to continue supporting your child with their maths practice at home, whether it's reviewing these concepts or exploring some new challenges together. Thank you for your ongoing support and encouragement. Let's keep up the great work! We will be celebrating a specific Maths Day in May so watch out for further news. I wonder if you could work out which date we have chosen and why?

Our staff participated in an enriching training session on 'Kagan Structures' (designed to help children engage actively in their learning) as well as a 'Planning for Writing' session led by Mrs. Collins. This professional development opportunity has been incredibly beneficial, and we are eager to see the new strategies implemented in the classroom.
