Dear Parents,

We have reached the end of Term 4!

When we return to school in Term 5, children will be able to wear their summer uniform if they would like. Please read through the uniform requirements underneath to ensure your child is wearing the correct uniform, both for main uniform and for P.E. kit, as we are seeing lots of non-uniform variations being worn. Socks, dress collars and shirt collars should not be frilly. P.E. shorts or tracksuit bottoms should be plain blue, they should not have logos/stripes/glitter/stars etc. on them - plain blue bottoms are widely available in shops such as Primark or Asda. If you have any questions regarding suitability of items, please check with your child's teacher or the school office.

**Summer Uniform** (can be worn in Terms 1, 5 and 6) - Navy blue and white checked (gingham) dress with white socks or Navy skirt with white socks or grey trousers or shorts with grey socks to be worn with white polo necked t-shirt with the school crest.

**Winter Uniform** (can be worn all year round) - White blouse or shirt to be worn with a school tie and Navy blue cardigan or jumper with school crest to be worn with Navy blue skirt or pinafore dress with white socks or navy blue tights or Grey trousers and grey socks

**P.E. Kit-** T-shirt according to house colour and plain Navy blue shorts or tracksuit and black plimsolls or trainers for outdoor P.E.

**Shoes** should be brown or black and should not be slip-ons or sandals for health and safety reasons.

#### **Parking**

Could all parents please ensure that they are parking legally, safely and respectfully when dropping off or collecting your children. We have received a large number of complaints from local residents in the last few weeks complaining about inconsiderate and dangerous parking and abusive responses when they ask people not to park in certain places.

We have received information about one particularly concerning incident in Kings Oak Mews. A parent from this school has blocked a residents drive which meant they could not get out of their drive to collect their own child from school, who was therefore left very distressed when their parent did not arrive to collect them. The same family also had a frightening incident when a parent from our school nearly knocked over the residents child as they were walking around the back of their parents car to get in. when the family challenged the parent from this school they did not receive a polite or apologetic response.

Please do not park in Kings Oak Mews and please do not block any residents driveways, pavements should not be blocked by cars, as has happened on many occasions, causing families with prams to have to walk on the main road.

I regularly ask for our parents to park safely and behave respectfully, however, there are a number of people who continue to park and behave in inappropriate ways. This kind of aggressive and abusive behaviour is not setting a good example of how to behave in front of our children and it causes significant problems for the school regarding the local community. I would however like to thank all those families who do park and travel to school in a way that does not cause issues with local residents and who uphold our school values on their way to and from school.
