What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?


- The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.
- ► It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

Three prime areas of learning and development

- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- · Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Four specific areas of learning and development

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- · Expressive Arts and Design







The three characteristics of effective learning - how young children learn - are considered when we plan and guide children's activities.

- Playing and exploring
- Active learning
- Creating and thinking critically


What can I do to help my child?
