Dear Parents & Carers



This week, as part of our reflection on the teachings of Jesus, we have been focusing on the Parable of the Fig Tree, found in the Gospel of Luke (Luke 13:6-9). It's a powerful story that offers important lessons about patience, growth, and the opportunity for change. In the parable, Jesus tells of a man who had a fig tree in his vineyard. For three years, the tree had not borne any fruit. The man wanted to cut it down, but the gardener intervened, asking for one more year to tend to the tree and give it another chance to bear fruit.

The lesson of the parable is clear: God is patient with us, offering us chances to repent, learn, and grow, even when we may feel like we are not progressing as we should. It also reminds us of the importance of nurturing and tending to the gifts and talents we've been given, and how with care and patience, growth is possible. During assembly, the children were able to reflect and make links to the gardener being Christ allowing us all time and patience to help us to grow spiritually. We thank you for your continued support as we nurture the faith and growth of our students both inside and outside the classroom.




