#### **Dear Parents/Carers**

What a busy week! This week we marked the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord with a heartfelt assembly, reflection and prayers of intercession led by Year 6. It was a joy to witness their excellent knowledge and thoughtful reflections on how they can live out the Gospel values in their daily lives. From the early years, right through to Year 6, the children demonstrated not only their understanding of the significance of Baptism but also their commitment to embodying knowledge, compassion and spiritual growth.

This week, our Reception children have been busy conducting hands-on experiments to learn about the importance of washing hands to keep the germs away—it involved a lot of glitter as germs!

Year 1 have been busy sequencing pictures in preparation for writing their story linked to their class book Beegu, in music they have been investigating pitch and in maths they have been learning about algorithms!

Year 2 have been busy creatively exploring dynamics in music through dance and drawings and they have been looking at using adjectives to create a character description linked to their book, Toby and the Great Fire of London.

Year 3 invited their families to their 'Celebration of the Word'. A huge thank you to families for attending—it is always so lovely to see family members joining the children in their activities, especially as they connect to the Gospel and miracle of Jesus turning water into wine at the Wedding at Cana. The joy on the children's faces as they spotted their families in the audience was truly heart-warming. I would also like to extend my gratitude to the children for their hard work in planning and leading the celebration. Well done!

Year 4 started their new music topic linked to the Vikings with some fabulous singing and in science, they did an experiment re-enacting tooth decay using eggshells!

Year 5 have been looking at the effect of friction in science this week and planned an investigation to test which surface created the most friction and Year 6 had great fun studying the artist Andy Warhol and creating pop art!

Our Year 1 & 2 children have been busy in art club with their amazing sketches of the eye and our Year 3 & 4 cooking club children made apple crumble this week— I hope some of the parents managed to taste it!

Today, during our Celebration Assembly, children from each class won the Merit Award (see over). Congratulations to all our winners for their hard work and achievements which were also linked to our school values such as resilience. A special shoutout to our Year 5 and Year 6 children who earned their Pen Licences—a well-deserved recognition for their amazing efforts to improve their handwriting. Additionally, some of our children received a certificate as they had the privilege of representing St Thomas More at the swimming gala at Medway Park. They competed with enthusiasm and had great fun showcasing their talents in the pool. Well done to everyone involved and a special thank you to Mrs Robertson who provides all of the fantastic sporting opportunities outside of school for our children.
