'Love one another as I have loved you'

This week, we have begun our Lenten journey by thinking deeply about the First Sunday of Lent and the time Jesus spent in the desert. The children explored the challenges He faced, the temptations He overcame, and how He remained faithful to what God wanted for Him. Through discussion, sharing of the Gospel of Luke, they considered how Jesus' experience related to their own lives. They thought about the difficulties they may have encountered in their personal journeys and how, like Jesus, they can find strength in their faith to make good choices. As we continue through Lent, we encourage you to speak with your child about their re-

flections and how they can embrace this season as a time of growth, prayer, and trust in God's guidance too.

Our Reception children had a very special visitor on Tuesday – our Early Years Governor April, and they were so excited to welcome her into their classrooms again and proudly sharing their learning with her. It was wonderful to see them engaging so enthusiastically, talking about their activities, and showcasing their growing skills. I would also like to thank the families for joining the children in their 'Bring Your Parent to Religious Education' session yesterday.

Our Year 1 children had the exciting opportunity to perform beautifully and proudly in front of their parents in the school hall, bringing joy and excitement to everyone. It was truly heart-warming to witness their confidence and enthusiasm as they performed. Some of our children also represented us wonderfully at a Music Festival in the Central Theatre, Chatham! Again, they showcased their talents and were first up on stage performing in front of a packed theatre! We would like to thank Mrs Davies and Mrs Wilson for taking them and teaching them the songs.

Our Year 2 children would like to express a heartfelt **thank you** to Father Pawel for his warm welcome into the church. He guided them in learning about the importance of Mass and introduced them to the special vessels used during the service. The children were eager to ask the questions they had prepared in their religion lesson, and Father Pawel answered each one with patience and care. It was a wonderful experience that deepened their understanding of our faith, and we truly appreciate his time and kindness!



Our Year 3 children also visited Father Pawel at the church as part of their Religious Education topic on the Mass. Father Pawel explained the significance of each part of the Mass and the role we play in it. They also had the opportunity to ask him questions, particularly about the Bible - how it was written and why it's so important for us to listen to the Word of God. It was a valuable experience that deepened our understanding of the Mass and our faith.

Our Year 4 Children have been deeply engaged in learning about **Holy Week**, reflecting on its significance and meaning. As part of this, they have been writing *palm leaf prayers*, which have been heartfelt and thoughtful. It has been wonderful to see how the children have embraced the themes of faith, reflection, and hope that are central to Holy Week.

Our Year 5 have been out and about in the local area, completing a traffic study as part of their Humanities topic on the local environment. They have been exploring the infrastructure of Walderslade and comparing it to that of Rochester, examining the differences between the two areas. It has been a fantastic hands-on learning experience, giving the children a real-world understanding of geography, urban planning and the environment.





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Our Year 6 Children have been learning about animals' adaptations to their environments and to celebrate British Science Week's theme of 'Change and Adapt', they thoroughly enjoyed creating their own 'hybrid' animal and deciding on which adaptations it needed to survive its environment. From a Polagori to a Pennit (and many more creative designs), Year 6 combined great scientific knowledge with fantastic creativity!

British Science Week

To celebrate British Science week, all classes explored the theme "Change and Adapt" through exciting scientific investigations! Pupils got creative by designing hybrid animals, imagining how different species might evolve to survive in new environments. They also worked on adapting games for disabled children, considering how small changes can make activities more inclusive for everyone. Another fascinating investigation focused on testing which items change and break down easily in water, helping to understand what can (and can't!) be safely flushed away. It's been a fantastic week of curiosity, creativity, and problem-solving and we would like to thank all the teachers and in particular, Mrs Fitzgerald for all of her hard work in organising the week.

We would like to take a moment to express our sincere gratitude to Mr Link, our student teacher from Canterbury Christchurch University, who has been with us over the past few weeks as part of his placement. It is always a privilege to support students making their first steps into the teaching profession. 
