Breakfast and After School Club

This is a friendly reminder that, as previously communicated, all wraparound care bookings must be made through the school app. We will **no longer be accepting bookings over the phone** so please do not ask the office staff to do so. We have removed the need to book 24 hours prior to assist parents with last minute changes. Please remember that **payment is required at the time of booking** to secure a place for your child. There are still parents who are not following our procedures and this is impacting on the workload for our office staff. Additionally, if your child is not booked in for wraparound care, it is essential that you collect them on time at 3:15pm. There are some parents who repeatedly arrive late and this is unacceptable. Unfortunately, we do not have the staff available to supervise children beyond this time. Again, chasing parents for payments who leave their children without booking, also increases pressure on our office staff who have to continually speak to parents and chase debts. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us manage wraparound care effectively.

As the KS2 SATs assessments approach, I want to take a moment to acknowledge the dedication, hard work, and perseverance that both the children and their families have shown throughout this journey.
