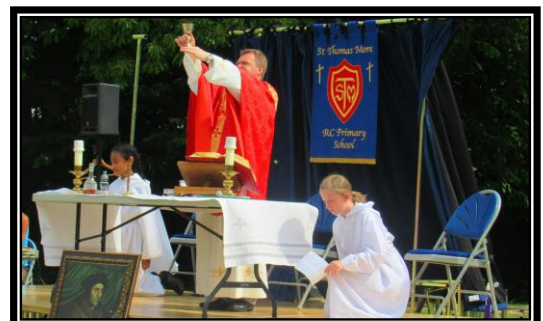
Our Vision

Our Faith

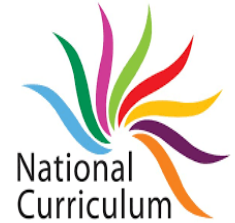

There are seven areas of learning and development that must shape educational programmes in early years settings. All areas of learning and development are important and inter-connected. Three areas are particularly crucial for igniting children's curiosity and enthusiasm for learning, and for building their capacity to learn, form relationships and thrive. 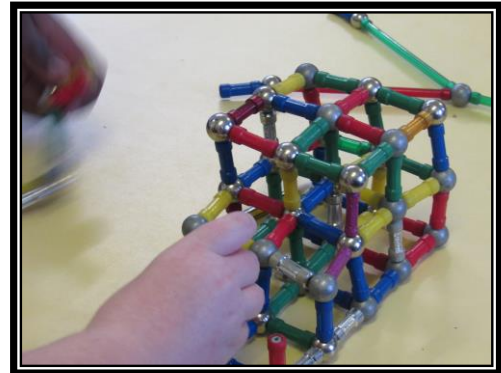

As a school we use 'Tapestry' to communicate with you about your child. The first day of handing over your child to the care of another can be an emotional time. As your child adjusts to experiences without you at school, most parents continue to want to share in these times. Tapestry facilitates this, by enabling a personal journal, or diary, to build over time. Our five drivers underpin and measure the impact of our curriculum.

High aspirations –

- We enable our children to have high aspirations and be aware of all future possibilities.
- Children will leave with ambition and be highly motivated to continue their learning
- They will be equipped with the right tools to be independent having experienced an enriched and broad learning curriculum and have an awareness of all possibilities on offer to them so they are ready for the wider world.
- All children are encouraged to work to a high standard and to continually challenge themselves
- Teachers will have high aspirations for ALL children

Sporting opportunities and physical health –

- We engage our children with a wide variety of sporting opportunities for both enjoyment and physical health
- They will have had the experience of competition; promoting team work, individual challenge and ambition
- They will have an understanding of pride and self-worth, know what it is like to be part of a team and succeed, or even lose and know how to be gracious in defeat

Moral Values –

- We ensure our children develop strong moral values around the core of Catholic faith
- Through our Catholic faith and moral teachings children will have a strong personal sense of morality
- Our children will be resilient to the influence of others and have their own mind, sticking to the values that are important to them



- Our children will be equipped for society and the wider world and make a difference in their own life and to the lives of others
- The Catholic faith is at the core of our curriculum, teaching and preparing our children with the Catholic morals, values, spirituality and strength to succeed in life; whatever the challenge

Emotional & Mental Well-Being –

- We equip our children with the tools and ability to recognise, understand and manage their emotions to allow them to achieve and maintain good mental health.
- Mental strength and well-being is essential for active and effective learning.
- Children will leave St Thomas being able to regulate their emotions and understand the techniques to maintain good mental health.
- Children will have been taught how to have a positive outlook and have the strategies for coping with upset and trauma.

Culture & Arts –

- We empower our children to be socially mobile with wider horizons by having a broad exposure to culture and the arts.
- Cultural understanding and exposure to the arts prepares our children for a world outside the classroom walls.
- Children will read, understand and talk about different genres of literature and poetry, discuss cultures from around the world and speak knowledgeably about life beyond the National Curriculum.
- We create new pathways for our disadvantaged families.
- All children to be culturally mature and ready for the next steps in their education and their chosen career path.
- We aim open their eyes to a world outside their community and broaden their life experiences.



SEND and Disadvantaged

St Thomas More is a diverse and inclusive school that aims to provide a secure and accessible environment for all our children so that they can flourish, progress and achieve to the best of their ability. Our aim is to make our SEND and Disadvantaged children feel valued and included, and to have high aspirations. Inclusion is embedded in our practise and teachers regularly review and reflect upon their own practice to ensure progress is made. Teachers and Learning Support staff are aware of and sensitive to the needs of all pupils and are confident in teaching children in a way that is most appropriate to their individual needs.

Our curriculum has been uniquely designed as a whole school to meet the specific needs of all our children and give them the opportunities, ambition and aspiration, as well as the skills knowledge and understanding, to fulfil their potential and enable them to make a positive contribution to future society.

Nurture and Well-being

We recognise the wide spiritual, moral, social, cultural and economic backgrounds of our families including sports, physical health and mental well-being (as recognised through our Nurture Accreditation Award) and draw upon the skills of the Headteacher, Victoria Ebdon, who is a Trauma Informed Practitioner, to ensure children's well-being is always at the heart of our curriculum.

Safeguarding

St Thomas More Catholic Primary School recognises the importance of providing a Christian ethos and environment within school that will help children to feel safe, secure and respected; encourage them to talk openly; and enable them to feel confident that they will be listened to. All those directly connected have an essential role to play in making it safe and secure.

Our school safeguarding team comprises of Mrs Ebdon, Mrs Le Breton and Mrs Deamer who can be contacted via the school office should you require advice or support or wish to discuss any worries or concerns you may have about a child. We closely work with Medway and Kent Safeguarding Children Partnership and NSPCC.

Extra-Curricular Activities



At St Thomas More RC Primary School we aim to provide all children with access to as broad and balanced range of physical activities as possible and develop pupil's sense enjoyment and well-being through regular exercise.

We want all children to engage and enjoy being and becoming increasingly fitter through extended exercise both in and outside school especially with a more sedentary and inactive modern day lifestyle that many have.

Children are encouraged to understand the competitive nature of some activities as well as being able to have fun through improvement of skills and games. We enter all Mini youth Games and Primary School Games Competitions to enable as many children as possible to take part in inter-school competition. We also run an active intra-school competition throughout the year.

Children are encouraged to take a sport leadership role within the school. Many become Sports Leaders, helping their peers to engage and enjoy activities during playtimes.



Forest School and Outdoor Learning



Our Forest School area provides children with positive outdoor experiences through play, exploration and investigation and participation in engaging, motivating and achievable activities.

Wrap-around care

At St Thomas More, we have a breakfast and after school club.

We open for Breakfast Club at 8AM
The club will be available 45 min's before school

Once a parent has been given a place they will be expected to pay even if the child is absent on one of the days.

The breakfast will not be a full cooked breakfast but will include such items as cereal; toast; porridge; fruit juice; milk and there will be an element of choice

Rascals - After School Club

We provide a safe and secure environment, which offers different activities which reflect on the child's voice.
