Dear Parents,

Thank you for your support this week in remaining vigilant with regards to potential covid symptoms and testing and for sending your children in with extra layers to wear in school so that we can keep the school well ventilated.

Part of keeping children safe in school is helping them to be prepared and trained to know how to respond in the event of an emergency whilst in school as well as helping them to understand how to be safe online and in the wider world. We practice with the children what we need to do if we hear the fire bell and what we need to do if we hear the lockdown bell. Once the children are familiar with the routines, we have fire drills and lockdown drills where the children follow the instructions they have practiced. Following practices in Term 1, we had our first fire drill before Christmas and our first lockdown drill yesterday. During the drills the children are reminded that it is a practice and supported by their teachers to remember what we need to do. Following a drill we talk with the children about how practicing these events helps to keep us safe.

We talk to the children about how we have a very safe school, we discuss how we have tall fences around the school, that visitors have to be buzzed into the office by a staff member and that all visitors have to wear lanyards so everyone knows who people are. The children are able to discuss confidently that our fire drills help us to know how to get outside safely if there was a fire and that our lockdown drills help us to stay safe inside if there is a different kind of emergency in school. When discussing the 'different types of emergencies' that could happen in school we are mindful that children need understand why we need lockdown drills but without giving them information that could worry them unnecessarily. Therefore, we explain that if there is a big traffic jam on Walderslade Road a build-up of exhaust fumes could occur and we shut the windows and doors to make sure we don't breathe in the air pollution. We also explain that if a dog escaped from it's owner and was running around our school we would shut the windows and doors and stay quiet so that we didn't scare the dog whilst we waited for the owner to come and collect it.

We will continue to help children practice their safety routines and will have fire and lockdown drills once a term. We are very proud of how well our children listen, follow instructions and know how to keep themselves and others safe.

You will all be receiving our Safeguarding Handbook for Parents and Carers via email. This handbook contains frequently asked questions about safeguarding and the procedures we have at St Thomas More School. Within this, there are also links to websites, family support services and wider safeguarding information.
