We began our week with our Celebration of Word and the Gospel according to Luke. We wondered how a person could have good treasure in their heart and looked at the Fruits of the Holy Spirit being love, joy, peace, trustfulness, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and selfcontrol. Therefore, our mission this week was to choose a Fruit and try to find ways to live out that Fruit during the week. When you live out the Fruits of the Holy Spirit, people can really notice.

As we journey into the Holy season of Lent, we are delighted to share with you the special ways our school community observed Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday. Shrove Tuesday, also known as Pancake Day, is a time of preparation before the solemn season of Lent begins. Traditionally, it is a day of feasting before the fasting and reflection of Lent. To celebrate, our children learned about the significance of this day. We are sure that many of you took the opportunity to discuss the meaning of Lent at home and probably shared a pancake treat together!



Ash Wednesday marked the beginning of Lent, a sacred time of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we prepare for Easter. It was a wonderful way to begin our Lenten journey together, reminding us all of the importance of prayer, sacrifice, and kindness as we prepare for Easter. His guidance, wisdom, and support are deeply appreciated, and we are grateful for his presence in our school's faith life. We would also like to thank Geraldine for giving up her time to play the piano for us all.

LENTEN ALMSGIVING FOR THE MEDWAY FOODBANK



We wish you all a peaceful and restful weekend.


