Intent	Implementation
Use GetSet4PE to track clubs and competitions throughout the year.	Set up pupils and classes on the scheme so teachers can access and put in data if they run club or input those pupils that access events and competitions.
Use GetSet4PE to assess pupils more thoroughly at the end of each term.	Once pupils data is in the system, assessment forms can be downloaded at the end of each teaching unit and input be uploaded onto the system.
Use professional coach to work alongside teachers for improve confidence and quality of PE teaching	Use local qualified coaching company to provide one coach for one day a week, who will then work alongside 2 different year groups (2 classes per morning sessions and 2 classes for afternoon sessions)
